Cashless catering system at CSIA & Biometrics Frequently Asked Questions

We use cashless tills alongside a system known as Biometric Technology in all our food outlets here at CSIA, which improves our ability to serve food quickly and efficiently, reducing the amount of cash circulating within the school and making the process of getting a school lunch easier for those students eligible for free school meals. The system works by scanning the student's index fingerprint to generate a unique number, which is then used to identify the student and allow them to spend money from their cashless account. The finger print image cannot be used by any other system or in any other way in the school.

How does it work? Students choose their lunch items and scan their finger at the till point, this then displays their name, photo and account balance. The till operator then enters the food purchases on the till which deducts the total from the account and the transaction is complete. It is also possible to display detailed allergy information on an individual student basis, and restrict the sale of items containing specific allergens; if this is required please contact our Reception team to discuss.

Payment options: You can either pay online via the ParentPay icon on our website, or by students loading their cash into one of the three cash loaders in school to top up their account manually before going for lunch.

What about Free School Meals? Students eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) will be automatically allocated their daily lunch allowance (currently £2.40 per day) by the system. When students take their meal choice to the cashless tills and identify themselves with their biometric scan the system will deduct the cost of the meal from their daily allowance. Using the cashless system means that the FSM process is entirely confidential. Students eligible for FSM are of course welcome to top up their accounts using ParentPay/cash loaders should they wish to purchase additional items.

What is ParentPay? ParentPay is our easy to use online payments system which offers you the freedom to make online payments whenever and wherever you like, 24/7. The technology used is of the highest internet security available ensuring that your money will reach school safely – offering you peace of mind: payments can continue to be made by credit/debit card or also by cash through local shops offering PayPoint (Note: CSIA does also provide on site cash loaders for dinner money where parents/carers would prefer not to use ParentPay). Full payment histories and statements are available to you securely online at anytime: your children will not have to worry about losing money at school. In addition to cashless catering CSIA also use ParentPay for our trips and visits

Can I set a daily spending limit? Yes, the daily spending limit is automatically set at £5 per student per day, so you can top up as much or as little as you like in advance and be assured that it will last. Spending limits can be adjusted for individual students, if you wish to either increase or decrease the daily limit please contact Reception.

What is Biometric authentication? Biometric identification is simply one way of quickly and uniquely recognising users in a way that can't be forgotten or lost. The system relies on the unique biological characteristics (e.g. finger image, or other unique characteristic) of individuals to verify identity for secure access to electronic systems. By measuring an individual's physical features in an authentication inquiry and comparing this data with stored biometric reference data, the identity of a specific user is determined.

How does it work? By taking an scan of your child's index finger we can turn this information into a digital signature that can then be recognised by our systems. When the student places their finger on the scanner at the tills the software matches their biometric image with the unique digital signature held in the database. Students will then be able to purchase food and check account balances by simply placing a finger on a digital scanner.

What does the law that relates to school say about biometrics? The Information Commissioner considers all biometric information to be personal data as defined by the Data Protection Act 1998; this means that it must be obtained, used and stored in accordance with that act. The Protection of Freedoms Act 2012 changed the way that schools are allowed to use biometric data in schools and colleges when used as part of an automated biometric recognition system.

Are the fingerprints stored? No. The fingerprint is only used to generate a collection of data points which is then encrypted. The fingerprint reader looks for specific patterns and unique identifiers on the finger, assigning specific data to each point - the fingerprint is never actually recorded.

Can the secure data be reversed to produce a fingerprint? No. The data points produced by the algorithm can't be reversed to produce a full fingerprint. The data is fully encrypted to military grade standards and even if this was to be broken, trying to reproduce a fingerprint from the data points could never produce anything usable Parental Consent: We hope once you have read the key facts that you will support this initiative and give consent on the attached admissions form. Please note that we are encouraging you to credit your child's Parent Pay account rather than them bringing cash into school. However we realise that some parents/carers would prefer to still give cash and that will be possible using the top up readers in school, as stated above.

I don't want my child to be entered in to the biometric database, what alternatives are there? Any pupil who wishes to opt out of our biometric database will be issued with a 4 digit PIN number as an alternative.
